## WISE Shaftoe Trust Academy – PE Sports Grant Plan for 2017 -2018

Schools must use the funding to make **additional and sustainable** improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

At WISE Shaftoe Trust Academy we will use the Primary PE and Sport Premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that our school already offers
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Increased amount of time pupils have with specialist PE teacher (from 2 terms per year to 3 terms per year and hence increase in competency of staff to teach PE long term).</li> <li>• Wider range of after school clubs now (netball, gymnastics, badminton and golf).</li> <li>• Purchase of new PE equipment to resource lessons and clubs</li> <li>• Increased number of competitive opportunities developing due to new sports co-ordinator network and availability of funding for transport</li> <li>• Involvement in West Tynedale football and netball tournaments</li> <li>• Link established with Allendale cricket club which will result in coaching input, Newcastle Falcons for support coaching rugby and Close House for support with golf.</li> <li>• Coach from local West Tyne Rugby Club also runs after school rugby club in Autumn term</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Peer mentoring program (to be carried out in the Summer term 2018) Year5/6 pupils will then help encourage the younger children to be more active at playtimes.</li> <li>• Begin a gymnastics club for year2/3 to begin to develop pupils' skills at an earlier age.</li> <li>• Further training in netball coaching for PE co-ordinator.</li> <li>• Fund the Family Funs initiative in the Summer term (this initiative targets less active EYFS children and was successfully run last academic year.</li> </ul>
